As the author of your thesis, you are fully responsible of its content

Intellectual property and scientific integrity

Thoroughly cite your sources to ensure references used are easily identifiable and to prevent you from any plagiarism accusations.

The use of copyrighted images or figures within your thesis falls under fair use. If you reuse more than 20 images, you need to get permission from the authors to make your thesis available in open access on HAL. Please properly credit the reused images. You are not allowed to modify a copyrighted image.

The content of your thesis should follow current norms and legislation regarding the use and protection of the research participants' personal data.

Papers featured in the thesis

Your thesis will eventually be available in open access on HAL (see « Thesis Dissemination » information sheet). Its content should then adhere to the legal framework and publishers' policies on open access.

Papers published in open access under a Creative Commons license attributing the rights to the authors can be included in the thesis in its published version (version with the journal's logo and template). Papers that do not meet these criteria can be included in the thesis in their accepted version (final version of the paper without the publisher's formatting).

ATTENTION: Depending on publishers' policies, an embargo period might be required before the thesis is made available in open access. In accordance with the Bill for a Digital Republic, if your research is funded by at least 50% of European or French public funds, this embargo period cannot exceed 6 months in STEM and 12 months in the Humanities.

Licenses

In addition to the intellectual property rights inherent to the legal deposit of your thesis, you can, if you wish to, further specify the conditions of availability and reuse of your work through a free license such as Creative Commons licenses.
